

## Recycled Yogurt Plant Containers



### Supplies:

- Yogurt containers- For this planter, sizes around 32oz work best, plastic ice-cream containers could work too!
- Hammer and nail
- Acrylic paint
- Utility knife
- Planting soil
- Seeds

\*\* Bonus supplies- use stencils or stamps to add fun designs to your planter!

- 1) Using a nail and hammer gently put a few drain holes in the bottom of the container. Sometimes this causes the container to split and crack a little. Buts that's okay, you a need a place for water to drain! You could also use a power drill to this as well.
- 2) Draw a line about 1-3 inches from the top of the container. You don't need to be super precise; sometimes I cut more inches off the top, some less. It's fun to have variety.
- 3) With the utility knife cut off about two inches from the top of the container-, be careful! This is a part for adults to do. This makes a nice water collection base for your planter. Take the top of the container and stick to the part that you cut off.
- 4) Paint your masterpiece



- 5) Plant your seeds
- 6) Watch them grow!
